Challenge: another videoconferencing tool?



SURF videoconferencing: videoconferencing without fuss

- no software download
- no addons
- no license
- guests do not have to log in
- Hosted in the Netherlands, at SURF servers which guarantees **privacy** and a high level of **security**
- Relatively low costs





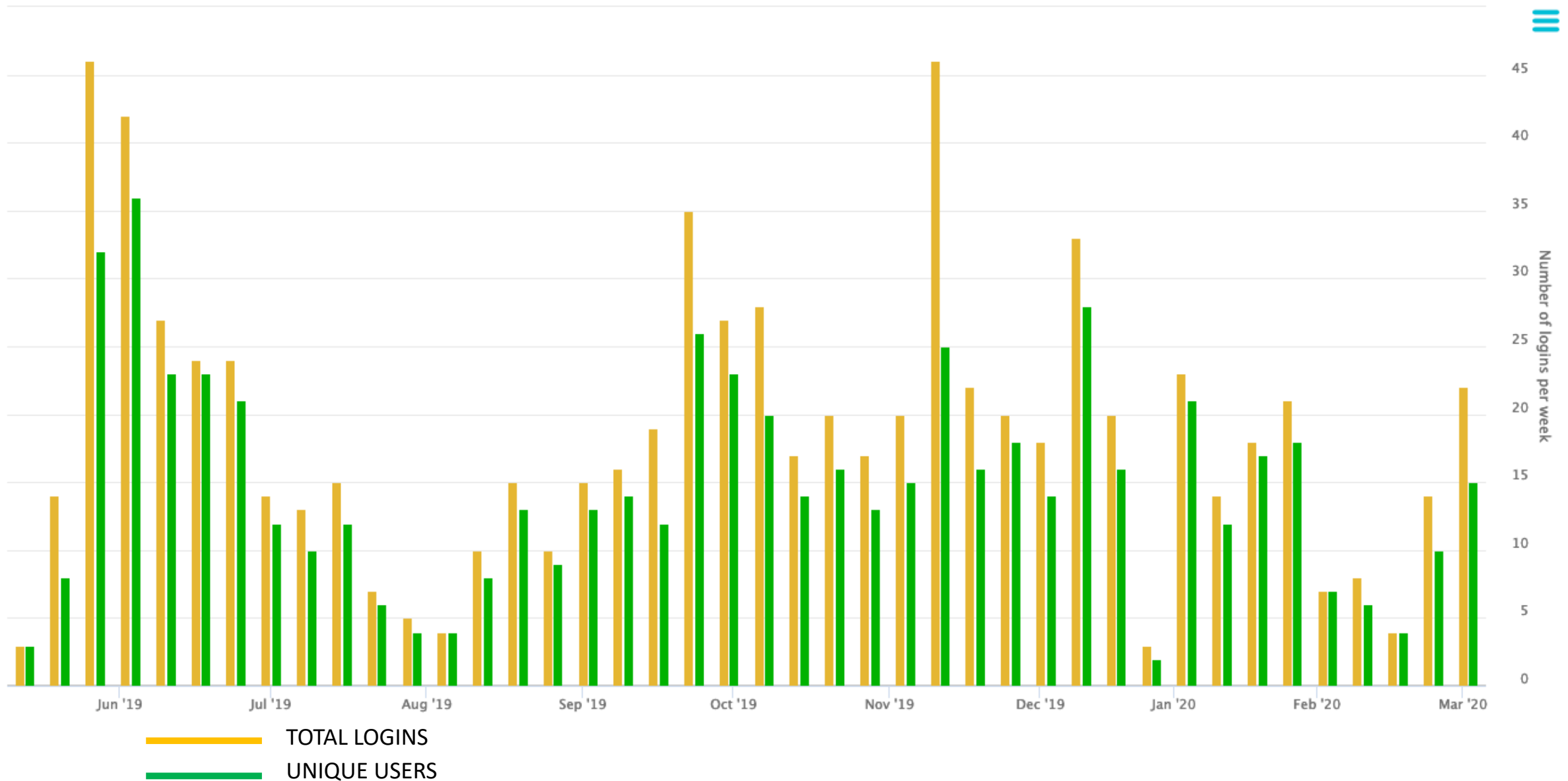

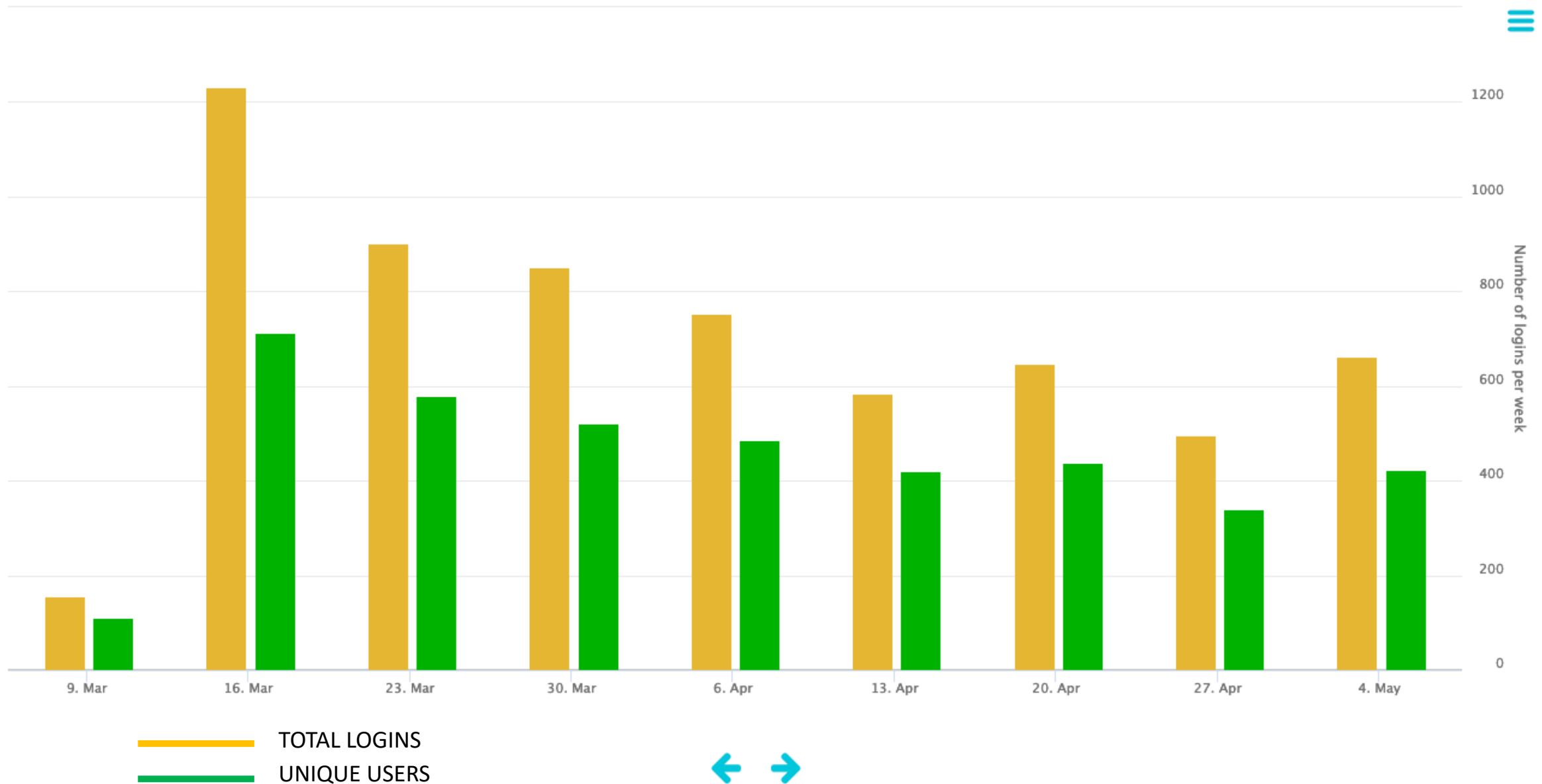
SURF videoconferencing usage 19/20

Logins per week



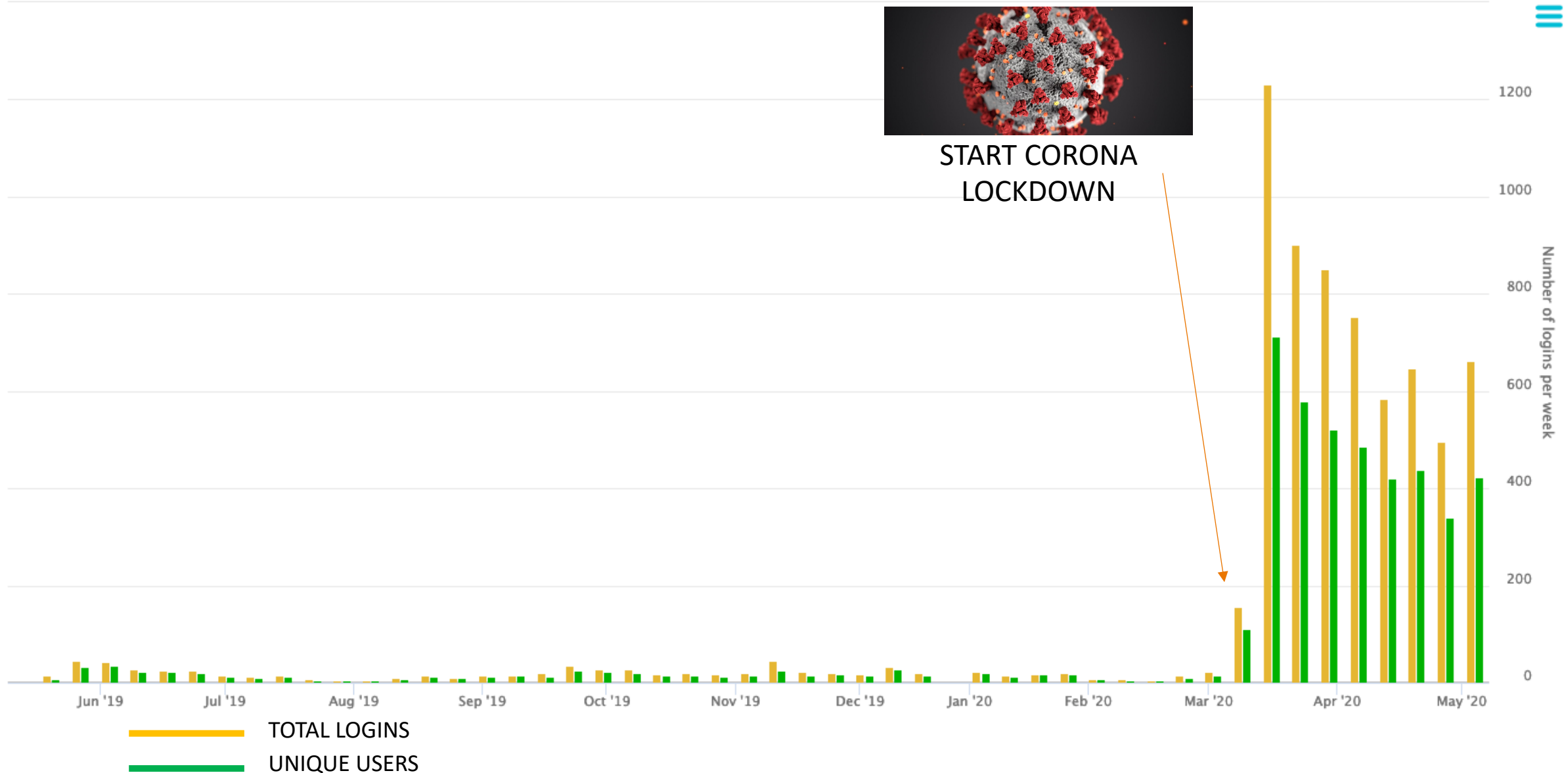
SURF videoconferencing usage since lockdown in Netherlands

Logins per week

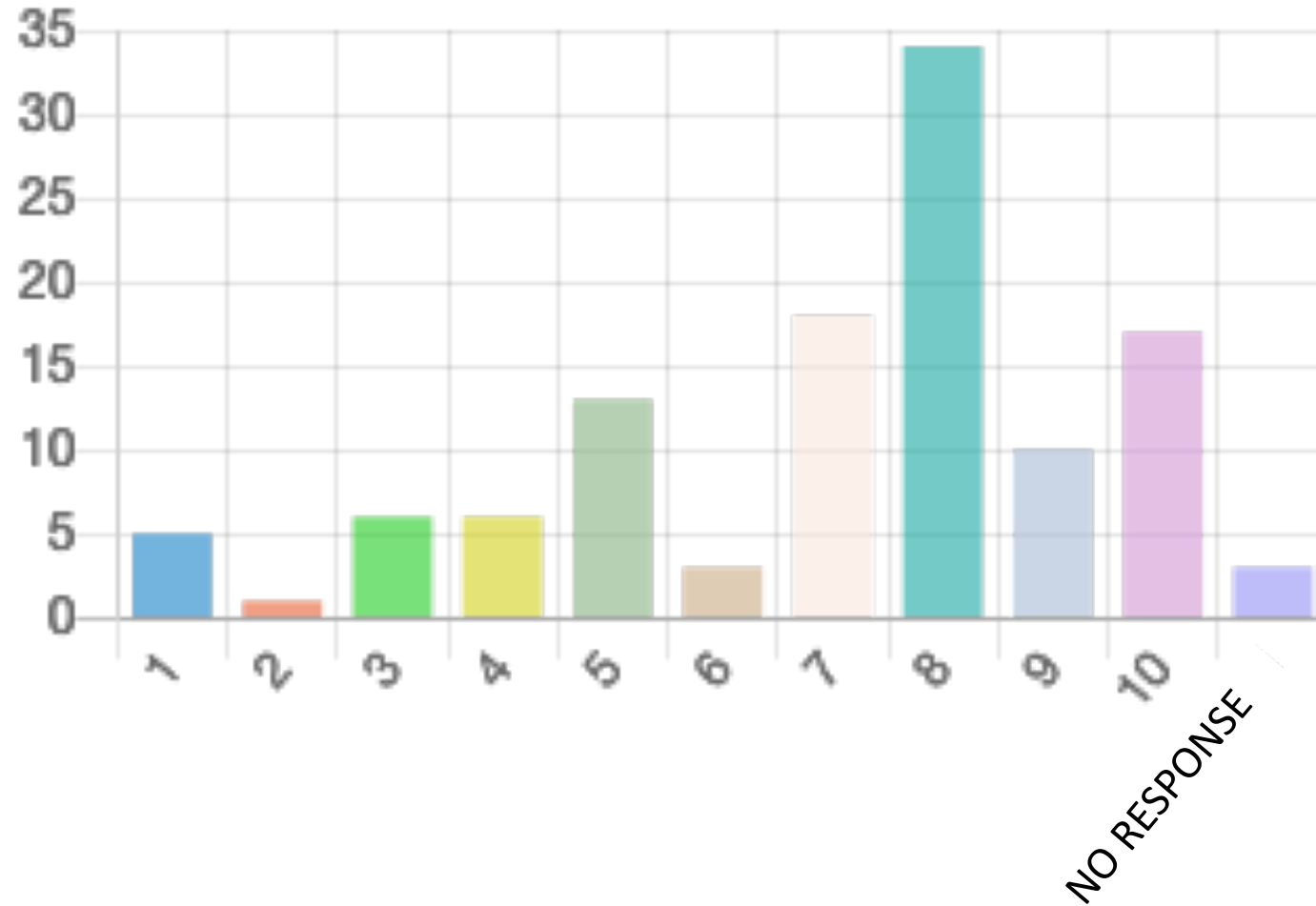


More challenges

- Because of the growth we had to scale up.
- More usage means more questions and more issues. This led to a drop in the amount of users
- Lack of support of Safari and Firefox browsers. Works best with chromium browsers.
 - Usage of Firefox browsers could cause problems in a conference for all users.
 - Since May 5 Firefox released an update, v76, this is a big improvement.

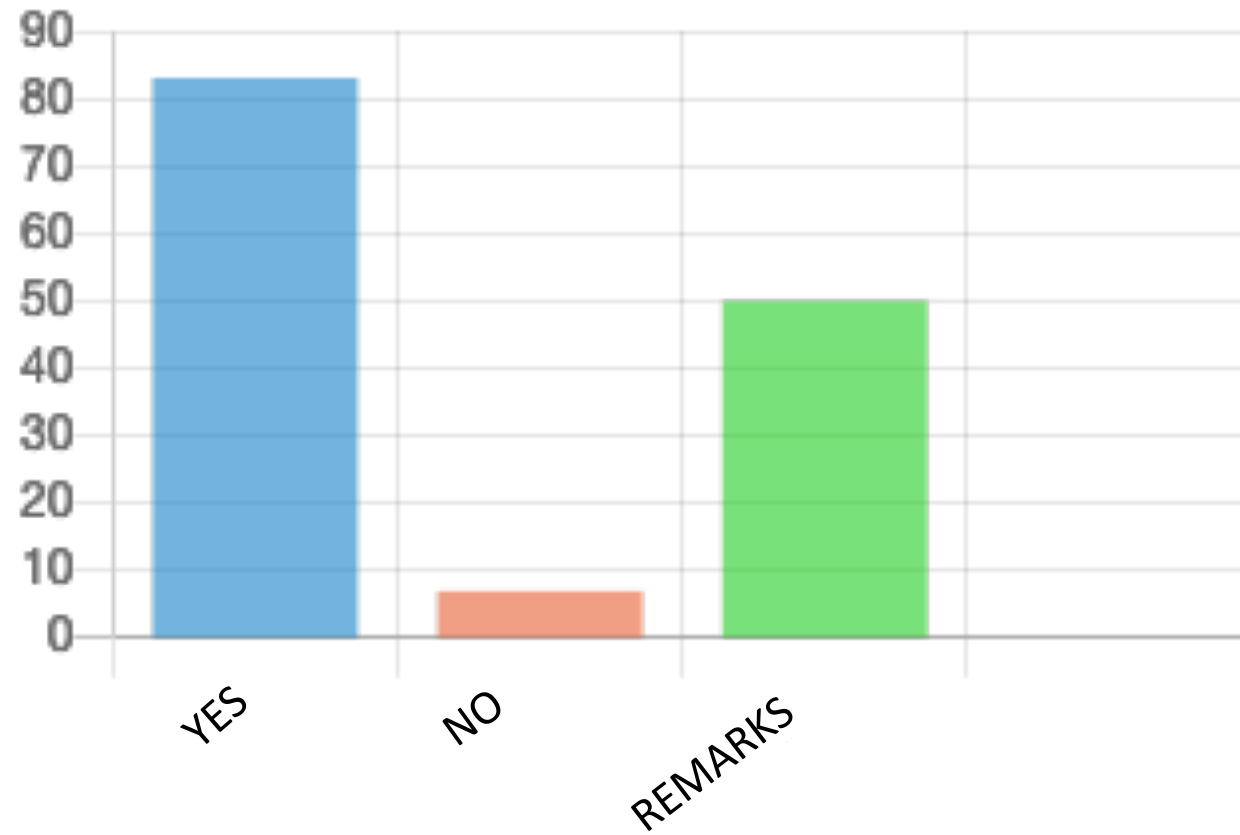
